Dear Parents:

This letter is to inform you that the Gwinnett County Health Department has notified us of a case of Tuberculosis (TB) at Camp Creek Elementary School. The student is being treated for the condition. Our school has assisted the Gwinnett County Health Department as they determined which students and faculty may have been in close and continuous contact with this student. Identified students/faculty will need to have a TB skin test. This test, administered by health officials, will be done free-of-charge. **Those individuals identified as needing to be tested have been notified by a separate letter of the testing information.**

The health and welfare of our students and staff is important to our school community. The Health Department has provided information about TB (*see attached*) that should answer many questions you might have. Camp Creek Elementary School will work closely with the Health Department to monitor this situation closely and provide additional information to you, as it is available.

The Gwinnett County Health Department has told us that there are two very important things to keep in mind about tuberculosis:

- 1) First, Tuberculosis is a disease that is hard to spread to others. Close and continuous contact over hours is necessary to transmit (give) the disease to another person.
- 2) Second, even if a person is infected with (given) the TB germ, they cannot give it to another person without being ill with the disease themselves.
